Shrewd Generosity Luke 16:1-9 Kingdom Come: The Gospel According to Luke

¹ He also said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was wasting his possessions. ² And he called him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Turn in the account of your management, for you can no longer be manager.' ³ And the manager said to himself, 'What shall I do, since my master is taking the management away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴ I have decided what to do, so that when I am removed from management, people may receive me into their houses.' ⁵ So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he said to the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' ⁶ He said, 'A hundred measures of oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, and sit down quickly and write fifty.' ⁷ Then he said to another, 'And how much do you owe?' He said, 'A hundred measures of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, and write eighty.' ⁸ The master commended the dishonest manager for his shrewdness. For the sons of this world are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than the sons of light. ⁹ And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous wealth, so that when it fails they may receive you into the eternal dwellings.

Sermon Outline

1. The Shrewd Generosity of the Dishonest Manager

This manager is the ancient equivalent of an investment manager or commodities broker. He makes his living as a steward of the resources his master entrusts to him. Despite the exceptional responsibility entrusted to this manager, he 'scatters' his masters possessions without purpose or profit. (c.f. Lk. 15: 13)

Suddenly, there is an immediacy to this parable that drives the action.

Facing his immediate circumstances, the manager acts generously with his master's resources in order to secure his future through favorable relationships with those around him. (It's as if this parable was given in anticipation of Zacchaeus encounter with Jesus in Lk. 19)

2. The Godly Generosity of Jesus's Followers

So, this begs the question, "Why is Jesus using the negative example of a dishonest manager to teach us?" If this dishonest manager, out of expediency, would practice such generosity in order to secure future favorable relationships; how much more than, should Christians practice generosity for the sake of eternal relationships.

(c.f. Matt. 6: 1-4, 19-21; 2 Cor. 5: 1-5; Ps. 122: 1-4; Rev. 7: 9, 19: 1-9, 21, 22: 1-5)

"The diligence of worldly men about the things of time, should put to shame the coldness of professing Christians about the things of Eternity." – J.C. Ryle

O.k., but what is Jesus doing encouraging us to use "unrighteous wealth"? What is Jesus able to do with that which is unrighteous? He is able to redeem that which is unrighteous and use it for his own glory. Therefore, we are not to serve our wealth; instead, our wealth is to be used to serve God and to serve others. (Is. 55: 7; 1 Jn. 1: 9)

Imagine how we can practice eternal-oriented generosity in . . .

3. The Generosity Par Excellence of Jesus Christ

"The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him." – Romans 8: 16–17 (c.f. Tit. 3: 4–7; Eph. 1: 11–23; Jn. 14: 1–3, 15: 15)

COMMUNITY GROUP QUESTIONS

Read Luke 16:1-9, and discuss the following questions.

1. How can you relate to the dishonest manager/steward? Have you come to understand that all the resources you have are entrusted to you by God for his honor and glory? Describe how you have grown in the realization that all you have is trust on loan to you from God.

2. Why should there be a sense of immediacy or urgency in our stewardship of God's resources?

3. Generosity not only has eternal significance, the eternal significance is relational – we are serving others whom we may have fellowship with through eternity. How does this motivate you to live a life of eternal-oriented generosity?

4. As a community group, take some time to catalogue all the ways you could practice eternal-oriented generosity toward those around you.

5. How has Jesus Christ been generous to us? How does the generosity of Jesus Christ propel us to live generously? (Think not only about his motivational example, but also about the life he gives us.)
