The Severe Mercy of a Pruning Hook Isaiah 5:1-7 Pastor Tim Van Lant

¹ Let me sing for my beloved my love song concerning his vineyard: My beloved had a vineyard on a very fertile hill.
² He dug it and cleared it of stones, and planted it with choice vines; he built a watchtower in the midst of it, and hewed out a wine vat in it; and he looked for it to yield grapes, but it yielded wild grapes.
³ And now, O inhabitants of Jerusalem

and men of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard. ⁴ What more was there to do for my vineyard, that I have not done in it? When I looked for it to yield grapes, why did it yield wild grapes?

⁵ And now I will tell you what I will do to my vineyard.
I will remove its hedge, and it shall be devoured;
I will break down its wall, and it shall be trampled down.
⁶ I will make it a waste; it shall not be pruned or hoed, and briers and thorns shall grow up;
I will also command the clouds that they rain no rain upon it.

⁷ For the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the house of Israel,
and the men of Judah are his pleasant planting;
and he looked for justice, but behold, bloodshed;
for righteousness, but behold, an outcry!

The Severe Mercy of a Pruning Hook Isaiah 5:1-7 Pastor Tim Van Lant

1. The Vinedresser and His Vineyard

By referring to the Vinedresser as "Beloved," Isaiah is telling us about the character of the Vinedresser—his vineyard is a labor of love.

- The Vinedresser exerted immense labor to build a fruitful vineyard.
- The Vinedresser sought choice vines to plant a fruitful vineyard.
- The Vinedresser waited patiently for his vineyard to produce.

The Vinedresser did everything for the vines, which they could not do for themselves, so that they would produce the good fruit he made them to produce. What more could he do? (Genesis 1:26-28; Ephesians 1:3)

2. The Vines and Their Fruit

What did the vines yield? Stinking grapes, sour grapes, wild grapes.

As much as we are tempted to explain away sin as a matter of taste, the six "woes" that follow in Isaiah 5 make it clear that sin is a painful reality in the lives of real people. (Romans 3:10-18, 23)

- Woe #1 Practicing exploitative greed (vv. 8-10).
- Woe #2 Pursuing intoxicating delights (vv. 11-17).
- Woe #3 Apathy to public sins (18-19).
- Woe #4 Disregard for the moral order (v. 20).
- Woe #5 Self-righteous pride (v. 21).

Woe #6 — The perversion of justice (vv. 22-23).

Do we live as if God exists to produce good things for our consumption, or do we live knowing we exist to produce good fruit for God's glory? (Luke 20:9-18; Matthew 21:33-46; Mark 12:1-12)

3. The Vinedresser Will Have His Vineyard (Isaiah 55:10-13)

The Father remains the Vinedresser, Jesus is the True Vine (John 15:1), and the fruit God's people bear are the fruits of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23).

The fruitlessness of men doesn't render God fruitless.

The Lord's Supper

Minster: We proclaim our faith as signed and sealed in this sacrament.

People: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Minister: Praise you, Lord Jesus.

People: Dying, you destroyed our death. Rising, you restored our life. Lord Jesus, come in glory.

Minister: We profess our union with Christ in his life, death, and resurrection. We offer our thanks while we yearn for the coming marriage supper of the Lamb.

People: When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory.
