NEW CHILD CHECK-IN STATIONS AND PROCEDURES — BEGINNING 1/12/25

We are implementing two new child check-in stations and new procedures beginning **January 12, 2025**! Instead of going downstairs, you can now check-in your children at the back of the sanctuary, near the bookcase and lift. The two new stations are clearly marked and in freestanding kiosks. These stations will be active until **10:15am**. There will still be a check-in station downstairs for those parents who may arrive late. The downstairs check-in station will ensure printing does not disrupt the worship service.

Additionally, we have a **new procedure for Jr. Church**. We encourage all parents to check-in their children **BEFORE** the worship service begins. When kids are dismissed to Jr. Church, an adult teacher will be at the back of the sanctuary to collect kids and take them downstairs to class. This will help parents stay in the sanctuary and not miss any part of the worship service. Parents will still need to collect their kids downstairs when the service is over.
